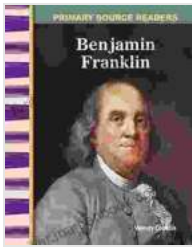


Benjamin Franklin: A Man of Many Talents and Accomplishments

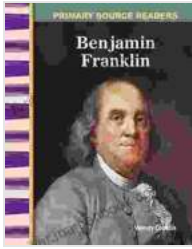
