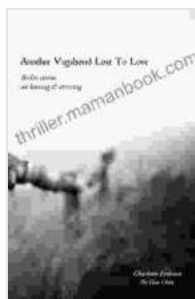


Berlin Stories: On Leaving and Arriving

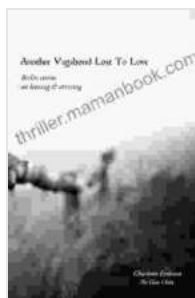
